All references and citations should follow the IEEE citation style to ensure consistency and accuracy [3].

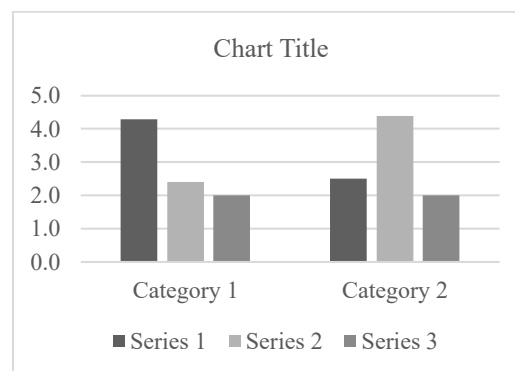


Figure 1: All the text and numbers in the illustration must be in Times New Roman and font size 10. Lettering and symbols should be clearly defined in the caption.
